Since 1953 the Behavioral Health Program has been the core program of FSA. Solution-focused professional counseling is offered by experienced staff who are committed to providing you with the best therapy for children, adolescents, adults, seniors, couples, and families.

All services are confidential.

HOURS

Counseling is available by appointment Monday through Friday. Both day and evening appointments are available. Call 215-757-6916 ext. 159 for the Intake Department.

STAFF

Services are provided by professional, licensed counselors, social workers, nurses and psychiatrists.

PAYMENT

FSA is a Medicare/Medicaid Provider and accepts major commercial insurances. If you do not have Medicare/Medicaid or insurance, you may be eligible to receive services for no or reduced cost.

Outpatient Behavioral Health

- Ongoing therapy, discharge planning, referrals, and follow-up
- Comprehensive psychiatric evaluations and medication monitoring
 - A Nursing Team to offer medication education, and act as a liaison with school nurses and primary care physicians
 - Case Management
 - School-based Services
 - Home visiting services to seniors
 - Peer Support Groups

School-based Services

Family Service is licensed provide mental health services to children and their parents in several schools throughout Bucks County. The School Outreach Program helps middle school children of immigrant families in Bristol Township.

Tobacco Dependence Program

The Wellness Program provides information on nutrition and appropriate exercise, and supports our clients in their efforts to develop a healthier lifestyle. They learn to maintain their weight throughout the course of outpatient treatment, and to incorporate the skills and knowledge necessary to continue to maintain a healthier lifestyle beyond the end of treatment. Certified Tobacco Treatment Specialists work individually and in a group setting with clients who are considering or are ready to quit smoking.

Supportive Case management Outreach Team (SCOT)

The Supportive Case management Outreach Team assists people with diagnosed mental health and/or substance abuse-related disorders who need assistance to achieve their recovery goals. SCOT helps people manage their illness, so they can maintain a consistent level of psychiatric stability, reduce substance abuse, and achieve a higher level of functioning in their community.
