'Facebook burglar' admits kayaking to Canada after arrest

A man labeled by authorities as the "Facebook burglar" on Monday pleaded guilty to escape charges in Bucks County stemming from his 2012 odyssey to Canada in a stolen kayak.

Steve Pieczynski, 40, of Lambertville, New Jersey, entered the plea during a brief court appearance in the county justice center in Doylestown. His sentencing was deferred, however, because he's facing penalties for several outstanding parole violations.

The escape charge was filed after Pieczynski missed a court date in October 2012 while he was out on bail for a burglary arrest. According to court records, Pieczynski was later convicted of burglarizing an acquaintance's Wrightstown home after he had learned through Facebook that the victim was on vacation.

According to county prosecutor Thomas Gannon, after missing the court date, Pieczynski stole his wife's car, which contained a blue kayak. At some point after, Gannon said, Pieczynski

called his wife from Canada and police were able to track the call to a cell tower near Toronto.

Gannon said United States Border Patrol agents determined that Pieczynski had kayaked across the Niagara River in an attempt to escape into Canada.

According to court documents, he was arrested in Canada in late October 2012.
