About the Bucks County Emergency Homeless Shelter

The Bucks County Emergency Homeless Shelter, a program of Family Service, is a temporary residence for individuals and families who have lost safe and stable housing. The shelter operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and accommodates approximately 70 people at any given time. Typically, about a third of the residents are children. On-site services for shelter residents include case management, job search and preparation, budgeting and financial planning, nursing, outpatient counseling and transportation. Contributions from generous donors and the incredible effort put forth by hundreds of hard-working volunteers each year are the driving force behind the shelter.
