



BUCKS COUNTY EMERGENCY HOMELESS SHELTER

The Bucks County Emergency Homeless Shelter is a temporary residence for individuals and families who have lost safe and stable housing. The shelter operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. It serves as a temporary home to approximately 75 people at any given time. Typically, about one third of the residents are children.

ON-SITE SERVICES

- Case management and outpatient counseling
- Job search/preparation resources and budget planning
- Transportation to appointments, job interviews and summer camp for children
- Health evaluations and referrals to medical and dental services

ACCESSING THE SHELTER

The Bucks County Housing Link is a telephone resource for those experiencing a housing crisis. In addition to providing Code Blue information and referrals to housing resources, the Housing Link also serves as the access point for the shelter waiting list (when appropriate).
