Benefits of Parents as Teachers

As a parent in our nationally recognized, evidence-based program, you are supported by certified parent educators that follow the Foundational Model.

By understanding what to expect during each stage of development, you can easily capture the teachable moments in everyday life to enhance your child's language development, intellectual growth, social development and motor skills.

Services

As a participating family, you receive all four components of our services:

1. Personal visits from a parent educator

- Receive age-appropriate child development and parenting information
- Learn to observe your child and recognize his or her needs
- Have your parenting concerns addressed

2. Parent group meetings

- Share your struggles and triumphs
- Learn from other parents
- Observe your child with other children
- Practice your parenting skills

3. Screenings

- Health, hearing and vision
- Language, cognitive, intellectual and motor development

4. Network of resources

- If needed, we link your family with services available in our community for:
 - Economic, environmental and personal problems
 - Food, formula, and baby care items
 - Housing
 - Medical care for parents and children
 - Counseling and psychiatric care
 - Continuing education and employment
 - Debt management and financial planning
 - Family planning

- Reside in Bucks County
- Have a child age six or under or be pregnant
